

Black Tie Gala Raises \$139,000

The 2nd Annual OZCF Black Tie Gala, held on September 27, 2003 at the spectacular St. Volodymyr Cultural Centre, proved to be a true success, once again surpassing expectations! Over 350 patrons showed their absolute support to this year's fundraising event. The theme marked the 3000th Anniversary of Zoroastrian Culture, a jubilant time for Zoroastrians around the world.

The evening started out with cocktails and welcomed the crowd to peruse the silent auction items. Items such as spa gift certificates, golf gear, works of art and hockey tickets excited the attendees as the bidding got underway. Guests were invited to have their picture taken as a souvenir. The wonderful meal was preceded by a superb rendition of Oh Canada sung by our own Kamal Driver. Dinner was followed by a live auction conducted by a professional auctioneer who, with the help of his young Zoroastrian volunteers, did a great job of getting the crowd excited over items such as a trip to Malta and the Dominican Republic, electric scooter, week at a cottage and a fur coat, to name a few. The live auction proved to be one of the highlights of the evening raising \$19,000!

The First Naturopath

Entering the Health-Care World: In May 2002, Canada received its first Zoroastrian naturopathic doctor. Roxanna Mirza, ND graduated from the Canadian College of Naturopathic Medicine and became the first regulated Zoroastrian Naturopathic Doctor in Canada. After receiving her regulation in Ontario, she spent five months in India working with world-renowned homeopathic doctors and naturopathic hospitals in Mumbai, Pune, Bangalore and surrounding areas.

During her time in Mumbai, she co-edited a book on pediatrics and homeopathy written by the esteemed Dr Farokh Master. Upon arriving back to Toronto, Roxanna has set up her naturopathic practice in the Humber Family Chiropractic Centre in Etobicoke. Along with initiating the "Health Talk" series at the Darbe Meher, Roxanna most recently gave a lecture at the NEXUS 2003 Zoroastrian Youth Congress in Toronto, entitled "Plunging into our Gene Pool- Causes and Preventions of Disease that Afflict Parsis the Most". Zoroastrians Participate at United Nations

For the second consecutive year, FEZANA participated at the United Nations' Fifty-sixth Annual Conference for Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) with a team of ten representatives. The conference on "Human Security and Dignity: Fulfilling the Promise of the United Nations", took place from September 8 - 10, 2003, at the UN headquarters in New York City. This conference was successful in highlighting one fundamental message: global discourse on security issues cannot focus on military security alone, but must be defined in terms of 'human security'. This requires NGOs to promote policies and programmes that emphasize sustainable economic and social development, human rights and environmental protection. The FEZANA representatives at the conference were among 2000 individuals representing 600 UN-related NGOs from 65 countries.

At the conference, FEZANA was able to offer the UN community a Zoroastrian perspective on global issues and was successful in promoting awareness of our community and its activities. As a 'youth participant' at the conference, I found it an enriching experience that I am not likely to forget. I strongly encourage the youth in our community to participate further in FEZANA's NGO initiatives.

The following is an excerpt from an article that appeared in the BBS News World Edition on April 18, 2003.

Historic Find Helps Save Parsi Culture

A collection of more than 90,000 rare manuscripts about the history and heritage of India's declining Parsi community has been discovered and is to be preserved. Many of the documents are hundreds of years old and written on slowly perishing materials such as tree bark.

The Parzor Foundation, based in Navsari in the western state of Gujarat and set up under the auspices of UNESCO, is undertaking the process of preserving and microfilming the texts.

Historical Texts

The head of the Parzor Foundation, Dr Shernaz Cama, told the BBC that it was essential that efforts were made to save these documents that deal with issues as diverse as astrology, astronomy, medicine, history, music, and more. The task - partly funded by the National Archives which contributed 300,000 rupees (\$6,250) - forms part of the Preservation of Parsi Zoroastrian Heritage project.

The Navsari project is therefore seen as playing an important part in keeping the culture alive and the international support it is receiving through United Nations is significant.
