President's Message

I would like to extend a special thank you to Jal and Meher Panthaky for their leadership in presenting the Parsi Natak "Gustadji no Ghotalo". Jal and Meher are founding members of the OZCF and continue to demonstrate their support for our vision and our mission through their actions.

In closing, I would like to thank each of you for your support for the OZCF. I look forward to the day when we have our community center and place of worship in place to serve the needs of our community.

Building Committee Update

The Province of Ontario has now completed its evaluation of our proposal and recommended the lifting of the Minister's Zoning Order (MZO) on our property. They reviewed our application as well as public comments from a notice they placed in local newspapers. No negative comments were received and many positive letters of support were sent to the province. The province will issue its amended MZO to the Town of Oakville soon so that the town can issue the minor Site Plan Approval (SPA) for development. Following various discussions and meetings with the town to speed up the overall process, the town was willing to accept and start processing our building permit application even though the MZO and SPA had not been issued. Our application was submitted in early June. The town will release the permit following their review and issuance of the SPA. We remain in continuous communications with the town, architect and contractor to quickly respond to the town's requests for information. We expect the MZO, SPA and permit to be issued soon so that we can get construction underway.

Parsi Natak “Gustadji no Ghotoalo” a Rousing Success!

“Ma-neh toh pate ma hasi hasi neh doo-khech!” (*my tummy hurts from laughing so much!*)

Many in the sell-out crowd of 600 experienced this pleasant ailment on the night of May 31 at Michael Power St. Joseph Auditorium in Etobicoke to see the Toronto Parsi Drama Group's proud presentation of “Gustadji no Ghotoalo” (Gustadji's Mischief/Confusion), their latest Natak (a comical, Gujarati play) in a series of classics. Emcees Sarishta Katrak and Khush Panthaky teased the audience and whet their appetites with their own jokes to kick off the evening.

The story centered on Jimmy Khurshedji (Zarir Cooper) and his sidekick Dinshaw (Burjis Mehta) trying to lure their girlfriends Dinoo (Katy Mulla) and Silloo (Shirin Chaturvedi) to their place. Being typically well-mannered Parsi girls, they would only pay a visit to their boyfriends' place in the presence of an elderly woman.

With only their college friend Gustadji (Kerkan Katrak) and no elderly woman around, the boys came up with the cockamamie suggestion that Gustadji dress up as the imposter elderly woman - his own Goola masi (aunty)! Hesitant at first, Gustadji agreed to play along. What he didn't bargain for was the arrival of Jimmy's Father, Khansaheb Khurshedji Khasukhanji, a mouthful in any language (played by Sam Gazdar), and Dinoo and Silloo's Uncle, Dastur Darabdaru (played by Jal Panthaky). With their mojo still motoring, these two could become enamored by the “lovely Goola Masi”.

The series of mix-ups that followed from this cocktail of confusion were hilarious. If that weren't enough, the arrival of Silloo and Dinoo's cousin, the gun-slingin' Kau Kakri (a “cu-cumbersome” name, played by Noshir Mulla) and the petulant Jilobai (Darabdaru's hot-tempered sister and Dinoo and Silloo's Mother, played by Jasmine Wadia) provided comedy that had the audience in stitches. Of course the final surprise arrival of real Goola Masi (played by Meher Panthaky) created more only more confusion.

Fine performances were given by the supporting cast which included Nozer Kotwal, Baji Langdana, Porus Pastakia and Aban Vazir, Jal Panthaky, Sam Gazdar and the showstopper, the cross-dressing king of comedy, Kerman Katrak had the audience in stitches.

In addition to the cast, Dhun Gazdar assisted backstage as the prompter and Sam Bharda with the sound. All of these highly talented and dedicated members often during a six month period prior to the performance.

Much of the show's success is due to the producer/director dream-team of “Janu and Janu”, a.k.a. Meher and Jal Panthaky. Brief Highlights of the Meeting:

-The Contemplation Session on the deliberation of five Gahs. Ervads Jehna Bagli, Adi Unwalla (for Gev Karkaia), Behram Panthaki, Soli Dastur, Gustad Pantheki, and Cawas Desai made the presentation on each Gah followed by discussion which was both educational and beneficial to all present.

- Navjote of the Adopted Children. A prolonged discussion took place, followed with several members expressing their personal experiences in this matter. A proposed resolution will be circulated to all members for further discussion and vote upon at the next AGM.

- Women as Mobedyars. In view of the enquiries from the community, regarding consideration of women for the training of Mobedyar, a discussion was initiated by Ervad Jehan Bagli to reconsider the criteria of qualification to be Mobedyar. After prolonged discussion it was unanimously decided to delete 'Zoroastrian males only' and keep the program open to any interested Zoroastrian.

-Financial assistance to young Mobeds to further their knowledge of religion and ritual performances. A proposal was tabled to empower the Executive to spend up to \$5000.00 a year, to assist young mobeds, to further their knowledge of religion and ritual performances.

APPEAL FOR MEDICAL HELP

"This is to let you know that our daughter, **Nazneen Dubash**, 9 years old, is suffering from "PH" i.e. Pulmonary Hypertension. It is a syndrome in which the lung arteries are constricted due to which the heart overstrains to pump blood into the lungs. This causes a continuous strain on the heart leading to a possible failure over the years. The normal pressure in any individual is 25 but in Nazneen's case it's as high as 56, which a few years later will further increase and can be very fatal.

The doctors in Mumbai have said that most PH patients rarely cross three to four decades of life, as there is no cure for PH. The only other option is a lung transplant. Only 45% of lung transplant patients survive beyond 5 years. This option is given to patients who do not respond to medication and whose condition is worsening rapidly.

Though Nazneen does not fail in this high risk category now, her condition will gradually move towards it. She needs to be kept on medicines for the rest of her life. Some of the latest and newest medications are not available in India. Also these medicines need proper testing for compatibility and response, which is not done in India. The USA & UK are the two places that have proper facilities to start, initiate and manage these programs under PH specialists and their teams. If not done immediately, we will need to visit a PH centre by early next year.

The medications she's been currently prescribed by her cardiologist here are Sildenafil and Bosentan. The latter is not available in India, but is mandatory for her treatment.

Nazneen needs to be taken to the USA Children's Medical Institute every six months for regular medical intervention to check how she's responding to the medicines, how much side effect damages have been caused to her liver and kidneys. Also these centers decide whether the patient needs a transplant and how soon. The current waiting list for a lung transplant is about 4-5 years. These transplants are only done in the USA/UK.

My husband works as a project engineer in Al Ansari Trading Enterprises LLC. since February 2004 in Muscat (sultanate of Oman) where all 3 of us are currently settled. Prior to that he was working in Shapoorji Pallonji & Godrej & Boyce Cos. in Mumbai.

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS

Cyrus Hira is a Graduate of Fanshawe College, London, ON, where he completed 3 years in the MIA Program (Music Industry Arts), being on the **President's Honour Roll**, for the first year. He won an award for one of the songs on his forthcoming CD that he has composed, written the lyrics for and sung as well. The same song won another award for the Production and Engineering and was also nominated for the Best Audio in a Video. Cyrus' scene was from a more serious and intense movie called 'EQUILIBRIUM'.

The award is "DIGITAL MEDIA DISTRIBUTION" award, given by a Company called Digital Media Distribution Services (DMDS). This company submits music of artistes to Radio Stations across Canada, by way of a 'Special File' that they themselves create on the artiste, and ONLY they can send the artistes' own work this way. These days you can't just go up to a radio station and ask them to play your song - it has to go through companies like DMDS, who are the largest in their field. Cyrus got this award because a couple of his songs, made at College, were frequently played on the Fanshawe College radio station and other local stations.

Then by choice, he completed another year of APP (Audio Post Production) and was awarded the under-mentioned, which spans both MIA and APP. World Religious Leaders Urge G8 Governments to Take Action on Violent Conflict and Climate Change

—Religious leaders of different faiths from 25 countries convene parallel G8 Summit for Peace in Hokkaido, Japan—

(SAPPORO, JAPAN 4 July 2008)—Senior leaders of different faiths from *Religions for Peace*, the world's largest and most representative multi-religious coalition, called on the Group of 8 (G8) governments to take bold action to address violent conflict and climate change.

The leaders were among the 100 who gathered for the "World Religious Leaders Summit for Peace" in advance of the G8 meeting in Hokkaido, Japan, held on 2–3 July 2008 at the Sapporo Convention Center. The senior religious leaders represented the world's major faith traditions, including Christianity, Buddhism, Hinduism, Jainism, Judaism, Islam, Shintoism and Zoroastrianism.

"We are united in our call to the G8 to take bold action to address the threats that confront humanity, including the destruction of the environment and climate change, extreme global poverty and deteriorating food security, nuclear arms, terrorism and violent conflict. Addressing these threats requires urgent action by the G8," the religious leaders said in a statement. [See full text below.]

"We must draw attention to the link between the health of the environment and war," said the Very Rev. Leonid Kishkovsky, Moderator of Religions for Peace. "In addition to killing people, disrupting the lives of entire societies and thwarting development, war destroys the ecosystem. We religious leaders urge the G8 governments to a reduction of total national defense and military expenditures and utilize the saved funds to establish an Earth Fund dedicated to environmental protection."

On Friday, 4 July 2008, a *Religions for Peace* delegation delivered the call to action to Japanese Prime Minister Yasuo Fukuda in Tokyo, Japan. The delegation included H.E. Dr. Mustafa Cerić, Reis-I-ulema, Islamic Community in Bosnia-Herzegovina; Chief Rabbi Gutman, Chief Rabbi of Strasburg, France; Rev. Nichiko Niwano, Chairman, *Religions for Peace*–Japan; His Grace John O. Onaiyekan, Archbishop of Abuja in Nigeria; and Sheikh Tayser Rajab al-Tamimi, Supreme Judge of Sharia Courts in Palestine.

H.E. Prime Minister Fukuda said he would deliver the religious leaders' statement to his fellow G8 heads of state. "Our global challenges require cooperation among all sectors and peoples. It is now time for religious and political leaders to dialogue and work hand in hand to tackle our common problems," he said.

"Terrorism—the intentional killing of innocent people as a way of achieving political objective—is never morally justified whether it is perpetrated by individuals, groups or states," said Dr. William F. Vendley, Secretary General of *Religions for Peace*. He called on the G8 to cooperate with religious leaders to address the problems of terrorism and violent conflict.

Ms. Stellamaris Mulaeh, a Summit delegate and the Coordinator of the *Religions for Peace* Global Youth Network, said she was encouraged by the religious leaders' commitment to work for future generations. "Youth must be involved in the advocacy as well," she said. "The voice of the voiceless must be heard. Also, we must use our churches and mosques and temples as platforms for advocacy and action."

The summit was organized by *Religions for Peace*–Japan and the Japanese Association of Religious Organizations and supported by Ministry of the Environment and World Federalist Movement–Japan Religious Committee. Additional support was provided by Religions for Peace–International. The Hokkaido Summit follows similar work begun in multi-religious meetings held just prior to the G8 summits in Moscow, Russia (2006), and Cologne, Germany (2007).

The *Religions for Peace* World Council is advancing peacebuilding work around the world in seventeen states including Iraq and the Middle East region, Sri Lanka, and the Horn of Africa.

Religions for Peace is the world's largest and most representative multi-religious coalition advancing common action for peace since 1970. Headquartered in New York and accredited to the United Nations, Religions for Peace works through affiliated inter-religious councils in 70 countries in six continents.
