## Obituaries

**Aloo N. Anklesaria** passed away of old age on February 18, 2008 in Toronto. Aloo was a well-loved, respected teacher who taught for many years, both in Mumbai and Winnipeg. May her soul rest in eternal peace.

**Banoo Damkevala**, passed away peacefully in the early hours of the morning of Feb 26, 2008. She had been in a nursing home in Naperville, IL for the past year. Her condition worsened on Friday and they placed a nurse with her 24-hours a day. I came to Chicago on Saturday, and she seemed to be breathing normally and even opened her eyes when I spoke. But as days passed, she became weaker and weaker. When I saw her last night, she did not wake from her sleep. She slipped into eternal rest this morning at 2:30 a.m., Chicago time.

There were prayers for her (Sarosh Nu Patru) at 7:00 p.m. at the Darbe Mehr in Burr Ridge, Illinois. It was a beautiful ceremony with 2 mobeds and about 70 people. The funeral ceremony (Geh Sarna) was at 10:30 a.m. the following morning, at the Toon Funeral Home in Downers Grove, Illinois, followed by cremation. According to our religious custom, there were ceremonies for 4 days to help her soul travel from this world to the next.

Banoo was loved by all who knew her. Personally, I don't remember her ever scolding or punishing me or my siblings, and yet we knew when we had done something inappropriate. I learned a lot from her and my dad, who were always content with whatever was served to them. We celebrated her 90th birthday in 2004. She was born on the Shahenshai NavRoos day. In Chicago, she was surrounded by many: my brother Bomi Damkevala and his family and my sister Shirin Kanga and family, plus the large well-knit Chicagoland Zarathushti community. They were all a source of joy to her. Until recently, she also spent a few months every year with Yasmin & me and my family in Maryland and then in Florida. We will miss her. ## Zarathushti Brings Crowds to Their Feet

**Cyrus Bahrassa** (17), a Senior and the Student Body President of the Little Rock Central High School, delivered a powerful speech at the commemorations of the 50th anniversary of the integration of the Central High in Little Rock, opening and dedication of the new Central High School National Historic Site Museum and Visitor Center, and that speech drew a standing ovation from nearly 2,000 people.

Fifty years ago, on September 25th, 1957, President Dwight Eisenhower ordered troops of the 101st Airborne Division to escort 9 black students into Little Rock Central High School and protect them for their full day in class. Among the dignitaries that attended the commemoration ceremony were former President Bill Clinton and his wife Sen. Hillary Clinton (both of whom embraced him at the ceremony after the speech), President Eisenhower's granddaughter Susan Eisenhower, the Rev. Jesse Jackson, Arkansas Gov. Mike Beebe, and several other officials.
